

➤ Highway


Livingston County is located approximately 80 miles South of Chicago on Interstate 55. It is also centrally located within 40 miles of Interstates I-39, I-57, I-74 and I-80.

Airway

Livingston County is served by the Pontiac Municipal Airport which possesses a 5,000 foot runway and jet fuel service station. Additionally, the Central Illinois Regional Airport (CIRA) is located in Bloomington, approximately 40 miles away. Moreover, Livingston County is located approximately 90 miles from O'Hare International Airport and 80 miles from Midway International Airport.

Rail

Livingston County is a strategic freight rail hub possessing the intersections of the following train lines: Burlington Northern Santa Fe and the Norfolk Southern Railways; Union Pacific and Norfolk and Southern; and the Toledo, Peoria, Western with the Bloomer Shippers Connecting Rail Road. Also, Livingston County is served by high-speed Amtrak Passenger service with stops in Pontiac and Dwight.

Heartland Community College

Main Campus - Normal, Illinois

Heartland Community College (HCC) was established in 1990 and classes were first offered in the fall of 1991.

Since then, enrollment has grown to over 10,000 credit students and 20,000 non-credit students. HCC offers associate and transfer degrees and certifications in 58 different areas. HCC also has a campus in Pontiac, Illinois.

Illinois State University

Main Campus - Normal, Illinois
Founded in 1857, Illinois State University (ISU) was the first public university in Illinois. With a 2012 enrollment of 20,502 and faculty numbering 1,394, ISU has six colleges and 35 academic departments offering more than 160 fields of study.

Illinois Wesleyan University

Main Campus - Bloomington, Illinois

A private university founded in 1850, Illinois Wesleyan
University (IWU) has a student enrollment of 2,000
undergraduates. Recognized as one of the nations
premiere private residential liberal arts universities,
IWU offers 39 majors and three pre-professional
programs with 184 faculty members.

Lincoln College

Main Campus - Normal, Illinois
Lincoln College's Normal campus, a private residential college, offers academic and vocational programs to 500 students. Accredited by the North Central Association, Lincoln offers associate degrees as well as bachelor's degrees in business management and liberal arts with a student/faculty ratio of 15:1.

Note: Institutions are within a 45 minute drive of Livingston County.

- ➤ Attractions: Livingston County is home to six museums and a number of other exhibits and displays. Most with free admission!
- > Public Parks: Livingston County offers 24 city parks and The Pontiac Recreation Center with a swimming and exercise facility.
- > Special Events: Livingston County is home to a number of annual events throughout the year including: the Threshermen's Reunion, a bluegrass festival in Pontiac, the Red Carpet Corridor Festival hosted by Pontiac, Odell and Dwight, Heritage Days in Chatsworth and Pontiac, The Illinois Basset Waddle in Dwight, and the Livingston County Fair.
- Vibrant Art Community: Livingston County enjoys an active arts scene with local artists and performing arts groups. Included is the Vermillion Players which is in it's 50th season in 2014! There are also several art museums and galleries including Fairbury Echoes, The International Walldog Mural and Sign Art Museum, and Livingston County Art Center.
- ▶ Healthcare: OSF Saint James John W. Albrecht Medical Center is located in Pontiac, Illinois, and is a state-of-the-art, 42-bed replacement health care facility, which was completed in 2002. This facility is also a member of The Mayo Clinic Care Network which provides OSF physicians the ability to quickly collaborate with Mayo specialists when they believe it will be helpful.

STATE OF ILLINOIS TAXES

➤ Corporate Income Tax

Calculated from reported federal income. The rate is 9.5% based on a 7% income tax and 2.5% replacement tax.

➤ Sales/Use Tax

Sales tax of 7.25% is imposed on the purchase price of tangible personal property for use or consumption.

Property Tax

The State of Illinois levies no property taxes. Counties, municipalities, and schools however do levy these taxes.

➤ Unemployment Compensation

Maximum rate is 8.95%, standard rate is 4.15%. Contribution payments are subject to Taxable Wage Base of \$12,900.
