Flanagan-Cornell High School provides a four-year preparatory curriculum with over 75 course offerings in a traditional schedule. Students have access to advanced placement (AP) courses, honors level courses and dual credit classes through Illinois Central College, Heartland Community College, and through enrollment in the Livingston Area Career Center (LACC).

PROGRAM RECOGNITIONS

Flanagan-Cornell High School has a strong tradition in their Music Department. Quite a number of students have been awarded individually in IMEA Choruses and Bands.

Our Future Farmers of America (FFA) students are involved in numerous activities and competitions with many receiving State Degrees.
